

FIFTY SHADES OF ETHICS: HOW TO DEAL WITH TOUGH QUESTIONS

Tihomir Lazić

This PowerUp session seeks to equip the leaders for responding to some of the most challenging intellectual, spiritual, societal and ethical questions that the youth (and especially students) encounter when trying to understand and share their faith in a secular context. Tihomir Lazić will propose a foundational conceptual framework for dealing with some 'grey-zone' ethical questions that require higher and more complex reasoning processes than simply retreating to ready-made, black-and-white, proof-text answers. What do we do when the Bible is silent on certain issues? What do we do when we are dealing with questions that are so remote from anything the scriptural authors and our predecessors ever thought about? While taking the concrete case study of the issue of premarital sex as an example, the workshop will explore different conceptual tools, factors and principles that those striving to develop a mature Christian mind need to be aware of

THE CLOUD OF DOUBT: HOW TO DEAL WITH DOUBTS?

During the period of their education, many students feel that the questions and challenges that are posed in the secular academic environment are seriously undermining the foundations of their Christian worldview. They are starting to doubt their faith, identity and mission, but they have nobody to turn to. They feel 'out of place' in their local churches, due to the lack of a conscious effort on behalf of their community of believers to provide a safe environment where they could voice their concerns and doubts, explore their faith convictions, deepen their knowledge and experience of God, and develop more refined, informed and nuanced Christian intellectual responses to the questions that they are encountering.

This PowerUP session aims to equip the leaders with useful ideas and tools that can help them to deal with doubts in their personal life or in the life of our believing friends.
