## 2. Name the primary colours

When we mix the Primary colours together in twos, we get three more colours these are called the Secondary colours If we mix them again, we get Tertiary colours! You can colour in the wheel above to remind you.
3. Demonstrate how to sharpen a pencil and how to clean a paintbrush

A pencil sharpener has a sharp blade that shaves off the wood around the lead as you turn it. Before pencil sharpeners were used people had to use a very sharp knife to sharpen a pencil. The very first pencil sharpener was patented by a French man named Bernard Lassimonne in 1828!

The paintbrush should be treated with care. To clean a paintbrush, I will follow these steps: $\square$

1. Rinse out all the paint $\square$
2. Clean with soap $\square$
3. Rinse again $\square$
4. Straighten the bristles $\square$
5. Place upright in a pot to dry
6. Make a design using 2 of the following

- Finger paints
- Coloured pencils, crayons or chalk
- Felt markers
- Pen, pencil or charcoal

## 5. Learn an art technique and demonstrate 2 of the following:

- Potato prints
- Stencil
- Papier-maché
- Bread dough art or clay model

To make salt dough, all you need is

- 2 cups of plain flour,
- 1 cup of salt and
- UP to a cup of water.
- You can also add good quality food colouring to dye your saltdough before drying!
When we say "cup", any cup works, so long as you keep the proportions the same.
Put the salt and flour in a bowl stir together and then pour in the water carefully stirring as you go.
Knead the mixture until smooth then its ready to model
Once finished you will need to bake it in the oven at $180^{\circ}$ until the object is hard and sounds hollow when the base is tapped.
Once cooled the item can be painted and varnished


## To make papier mache

- grab yourself a small bowl - plastic is best. ...
- tear newspaper into strips. You could use torn up egg box.
- make up a mix of papier-maché paste - 1:1 flour and water.
- dip the newspaper into the paste and layer over the bowl.
- you'll want a few layers - the more the better. ...
- leave to dry overnight or until it is hard. You can paint your item or cover with strips of coloured tissue paper or pieces from a magazine

- An invitation
- A bookmark
- A greeting card
- A poster
