Very few people had baths, if at all. In 1830 a census was taken in America that illustrated some people had not had a bath in their entire life.




Anaesthetics were rarely used. People had to endure pain.







### Victorians smoked a lot and had lots of health hazards

On 5 June 1863, Ellen White had a vision that pointed out the hazards of tea, coffee, smoking and promoted health as an aid to intellectual and spiritual growth.



13 March 1858, Ellen White had a vison which she called 'The Great Controversy'

This led to the book which helped the church formulate the Three Angels' Message focus of our teachings.




In 1863 Ellen White along with all the believers organised and adopted the name Seventh-day Adventist Church
