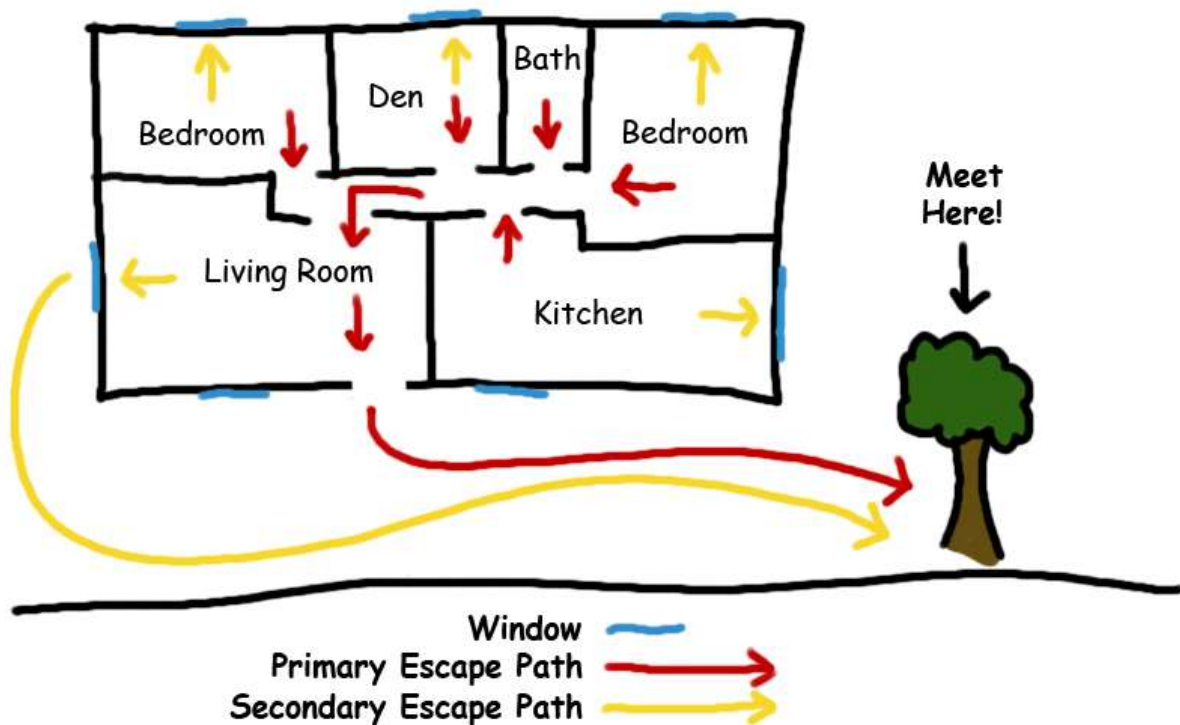
Emergency Exit Plan
