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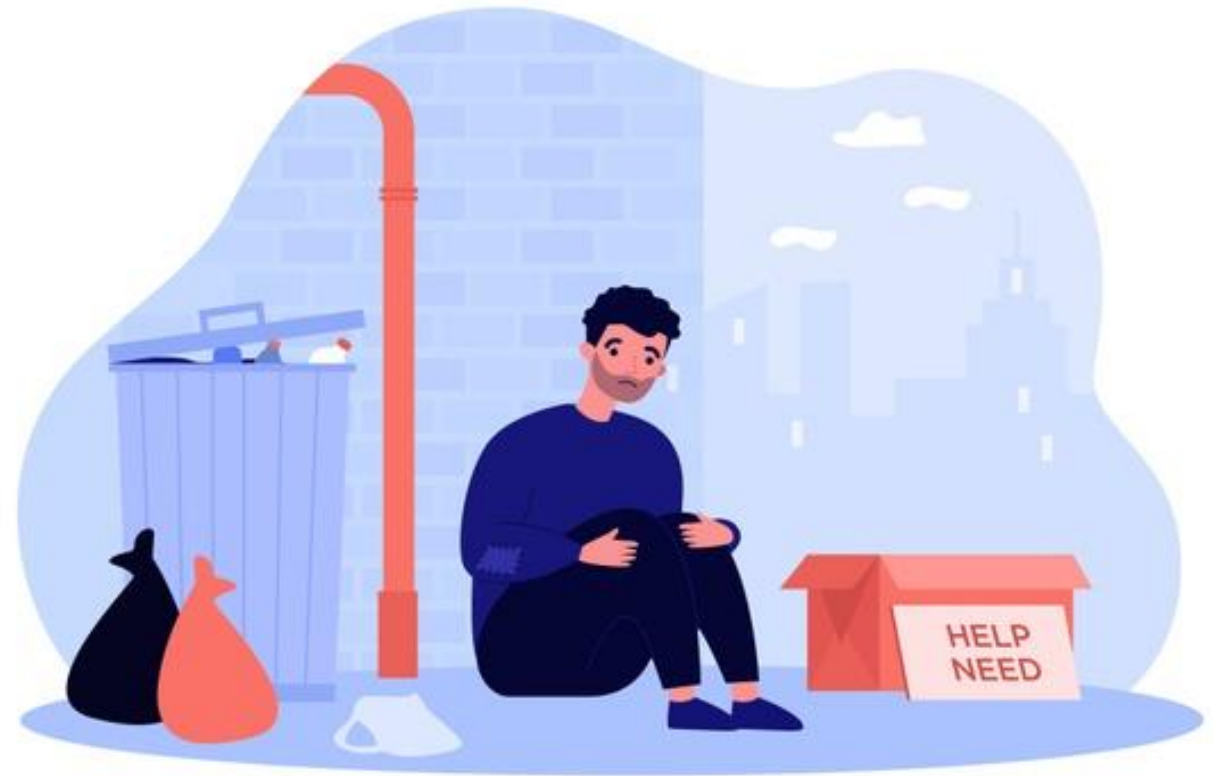

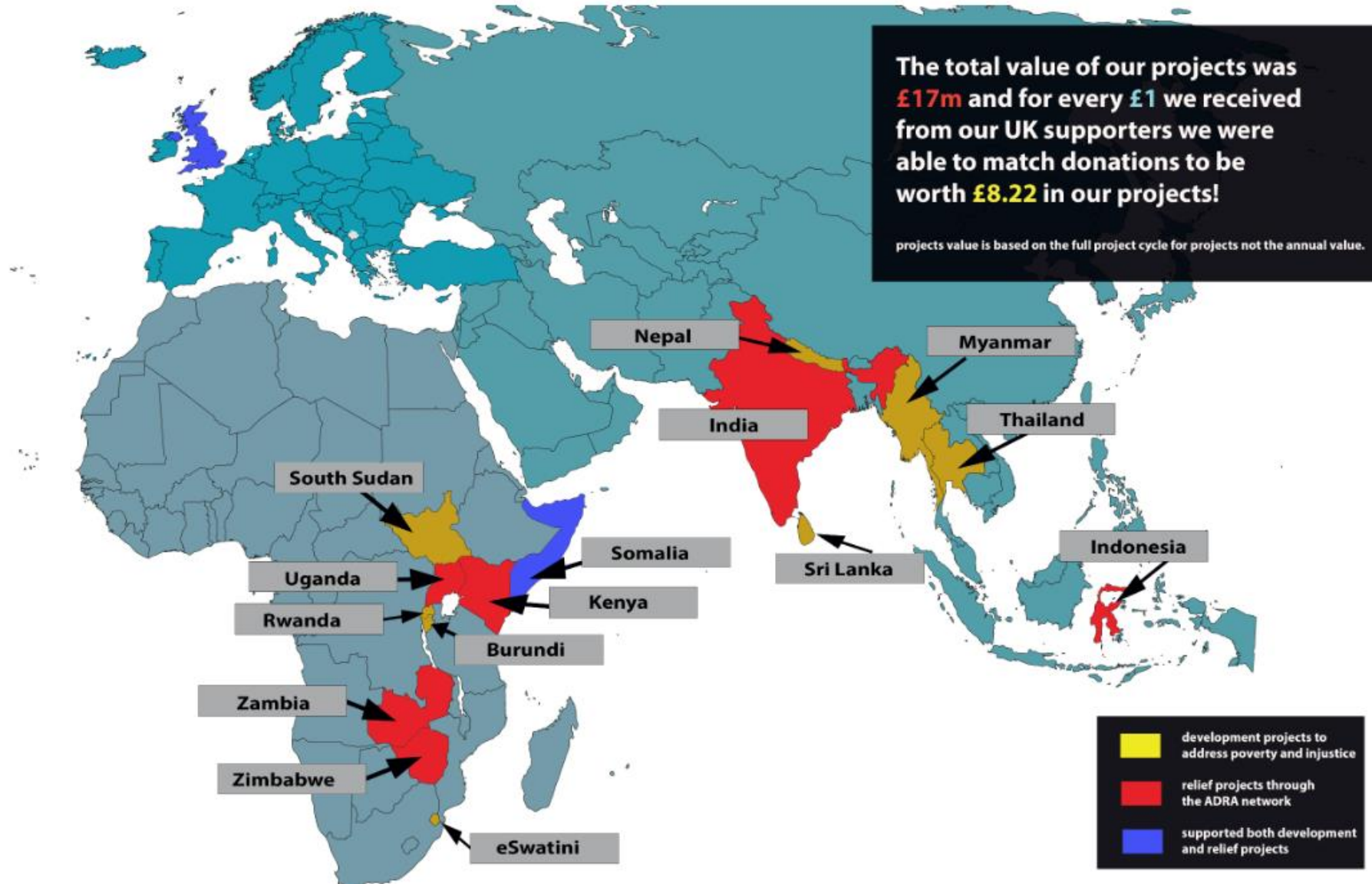



- Hold a collection drive for the less fortunate.

- Write a message of thanks to a community hero.
- Do household chores for a sick friend or neighbor.
- Spend time with sick kids in hospital or the elderly in nursing homes to
- bring some cheer.
- Assist in cooking a meal for a family in need.
- Use manners, smile and say hello when out and about.

- Participate in two activities to help someone in need, such as:
